Okeechobee

Pahokee



Animal Control urges pet owners to prepare for upcoming fireworks

CLEWISTON — Clewiston Animal Control have been working to remind the public of the problems that often come along with pets and fireworks.

According to the American Animal
Hospital Association, "More pets go missing around the 4th of July than any other time of year, and noisy fireworks are to blame."

"With 4th of July fast approaching we want to remind all pet owners to begin preparation for their pets," Clewiston Animal Control wrote in a recent public service announcement

"Between July 4-6 shelters across the US are the busiest with missing pet reports. Please take a moment to assure your pet is safe and secure this year."

National statistics report animal control officials across the country see a 30-60% increase in lost pets each year between July 4 and 6. In fact, July 5 is one of the busiest days of the year for shelters.

Clewiston's Animal Control officers recommended a few simple things you can do to keep your pet safe:

- 1. Provide them a quiet safe space such as a kennel or room.
- 2. Update your pets microchip contact information- if they have one, if they do not please get one.
- 3. Make sure they have proper identification on such as collar/ID tag.
- 4. Call your veterinarian NOW and NOT

July 3 to prescribe any calming medications

5. Walk your dog in advance during the day to tire them out or alleviate any energy before fireworks.

They went on to say, "For any outside animals such as livestock please make sure all fencing or pens are secure, you can also braid or tie an ID tag with your contact info to your animals mane/tail or you can also write your contact information on hooves with nontoxic markers."



However, residents are encouraged to support our local economy by shopping locally. All businesses are reminded that they are responsible for correctly exempting qualifying items.




